

VIRGINIA HOME VISITING CONSORTIUM OUTCOME GOALS

- Increased number and percentage of women who receive early and adequate prenatal care.
- Decreased number and percentage of low weight births
- Increased number and percentage of women who initiate and continue breastfeeding
- Increased healthy behaviors and decreased risky behaviors among pregnant women, families and young children, from birth to age 5, served by home visiting programs
- Increased number and percentage of women who wait 24 months before a subsequent birth
- Increased number and percentage of children ages 0-5 who complete scheduled well-child visits
- Increased number and percentage of children ages 0-5 who are on track with immunizations
- Increased number and percentage of children ages 0-5 enrolled in medical/health care insurance
- Increased number and percentage of children ages 0-5 receiving routine comprehensive developmental screening
- Increased number and percentage of families providing a safe home environment
- Decreased reports of founded child abuse and neglect reports for families served by home visiting programs
- Increased early and appropriate referrals to home visiting programs from physicians and early childhood educators
- Increased early and appropriate referrals of parents and children from home visiting programs to substance abuse services, mental health services, medical home and Early Intervention/Part C
- Enhanced existing early childhood community coalitions and increased number of local coalitions
- Establishment of a continuum of services across the home visiting network
